#### Summary



Propose to use remaining funds to continue funding elementary interventionists (learning loss needs) and STARS contract (mental health needs)



Once funds are fully expended, move projects to local funding to continue to make progress meeting student needs



Expect funds to be expended by May 2024 (four months before September 2024 deadline)
