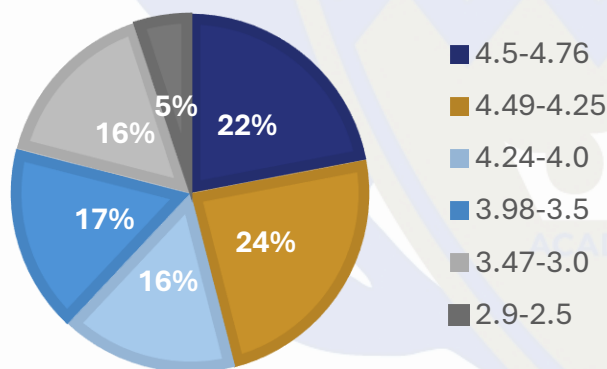
ABOUT BHS Founded in 1982, Brentwood is a 4-year public high school in the Williamson County School System. The school is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. Currently, there are 1580 students enrolled with 409 seniors in the Class of 2026. The pupil/ ratio is 21.7/1. Brentwood High follows a semester system, with ½ credit per course each semester. Students are enrolled in 6 credit classes. Each class period lasts 47 minutes, and the school day consists of 8 periods, including homeroom and study hall. Approximately three times a month, the day is shortened 45 minutes for staff development. The academic year consists of 180 days. The school is staffed by 5 administrators, 5 school counselors, and 95 teachers, 12 of whom have Doctorate Degrees and 75 with master’s degrees.

Brentwood High School is recognized statewide for its achievements in academics, arts, and athletics. The school has been consistently “top-ranked” in various listings, including a web-exclusive ranking by U.S. News & World Report that placed it among America’s “Top High Schools.”

Brentwood is ranked first for Tennessee comprehensive public high schools.

OUR HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAM

GRADING SYSTEM

Numerical grades are assigned for all courses at the end of each 9-week grading period. Semester letter grades are recorded on student transcripts.

Students enrolled in Advanced Placement (AP), Dual Credit, and Dual Enrollment courses will earn an additional five (5) percentage points for each grading period and for the first semester exam. To earn these percentage points for the second semester grade, the student is required to sit for the appropriate end of course exam.

Students enrolled in Honors courses, including those who enroll in honors level Math and World Language courses while in middle school, will earn an additional three (3) percentage points for each grading period and for each semester exam.

Beginning with the 2025-26 school year, WCS began recalculating GPAs of transfer students using the WCS weighted scale to create a uniform Weighted Cumulative GPA for all WCS students. Prior to the 2025-26 school year, GPAs of transfer students were taken “as is” from their prior school, whether weighted or unweighted.

AVERAGING POLICY

The averaging policy allows students to earn full credit for a course even though they failed the first semester, if the average of both semesters is 60% or better. Credit is not awarded when the second semester grade is failing. This policy applies only to courses in which a student must master first semester skills and concepts to be successful second semester: Math, World Language, Chemistry, Physics, and Accounting. If a student is successful under this policy, the earned credit for the second semester of the course will be changed from .5 to 1.0 on the transcript.

CLASS RANK

Beginning with the class of 2020, students are no longer ranked. A student with a 4.5 GPA and a 31 on the ACT may be ranked in the top ten at most schools, but at BHS, this student would fall out of the top 20%.
