Williamson County Schools Community

- Located 25 miles south of Nashville, Tennessee.
- Approximately 42,000 students in Pre-K-12th grade for the 2025-2026 school year.
- 52 schools:11 high schools, 11 middle schools, 28 elementary schools, and one K-8 school.
- The district's graduating class of 2025 posted an ACT composite score of 25.2 which is well above the State's average composite score.
- WCS ranks first in Tennessee among districts with more than one high school.
- The district earned top marks (all "5's") in growth for fifth through eighth grades and high school.



Curriculum

- Traditional, two semester, nine-week quarters. Students take a minimum of six classes for credit each school year. Classes meet for 47 minutes each day.
- The following AP courses are offered: Art 2D, Biology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry, Computer Science (Principles and A), English Literature, English Language & Composition, Environmental Science, European History, Human Geography, Macroeconomics, Music Theory, Physics 1, Physics C, Pre-Calculus, Psychology, Research, Seminar, Spanish Language & Culture, Statistics, Studio Art, US Government & Politics, US History, and World History.
- Honors classes are offered in English, Math, Science, Social Studies, World Language, Fine Art and Career & Technical Education curriculum.
- Dual enrollment classes are offered for junior & senior level English and History credits on our high school campus by Middle Tennessee State University (MTSU) and many students take additional Dual Enrollment courses through MTSU and Columbia State College outside of the school day.

- For the graduating class beginning in 2023, the weighted GPA will be calculated on all course work using the Williamson County Grading Scale listed above and will be listed on the transcript as "weighted GPA". The "Hope Scholarship GPA" be used as an unweighted GPA.
- Beginning with the 2025-26 school year, WCS began recalculating GPAs of transfer students using the WCS weighted scale
 to create a uniform Weighted Cumulative GPA for all WCS students. Prior to the 2025-26 school year, GPAs of transfer
 students were taken "as is" from their prior school, whether weighted or unweighted.
- Williamson County Schools will not rank students numerically beginning with the class of 2020. Beginning in 2023-24, Dual Enrollment courses will earn a letter grade on the WCS transcript and will also be granted additional percentage points (see chart below).
- WCS students must take an ACT/SAT test prior to high school graduation. The state of TN also requires students to pass a
 United States Civics exam.

What makes us different

- Page High School students must complete a Senior Project which consists of 40 hours of community service, senior portfolio, and a professional presentation to faculty.
- In 2024-2025, 780 (+72) students were enrolled in an AP course and took 1,459 (+135) exams. 83.5% of all AP test takers scored a 3 or higher, which was a 2.5% increase over the previous year.
- We offer nine CTE Pathways; Medical Therapeutics, Sport & Human Performance, Marketing & Entrepreneurship, Engineering, TV & Film Production, Digital Arts & Design, Veterinary & Animal Science, and JROTC. Students earn industry certificates, college dual credit, and opportunities to serve and lead in student led organizations.
