Williamson County Schools (WCS) has approximately 41,000 students enrolled in Pre-K -12 for the 2025-26 school year. There are 11 high schools, 11 middle schools, and 29 elementary schools. The district's graduating class of 2025 posted an ACT composite score of 25.

Renaissance High is an open-zoned Williamson County public choice school that serves approximately 170 9th - 12th grade creative students from across the district who believe they would thrive in a smaller, relationship-centered environment with creative peers. Renaissance is intentional in fostering the 21st century skills of creativity/innovation, critical thinking, communication and collaboration and embeds project-based learning and standards-based grading. Students apply and are accepted into one of our three CTE, four-year, elective academies: Film, Digital Art & Animation, Music & Audio Production. All three academies culminate in an Applied Arts Practicum intended to launch them on a successful trajectory into 21st century creative industries. For a small school, Renaissance offers a multitude of extra-curricular activities and service opportunities including Student Council, eSports, Beta Club, and student-led clubs.

Admissions & Curriculum

- Students must apply and interview to be admitted. Class size is limited.
- For the past four years, Renaissance has been in the top five non-academic magnet schools in TN based on ACT scores
- Advanced Placement (AP) Courses Offered: AP Precalculus, AP Human Geography, AP US History, AP Chemistry, & AP Studio Art
- Honors Courses Offered: Spanish III, Government, Economics
- Juniors and Seniors are encouraged to take dual enrollment courses
- Students choose from three creative elective focus academies:
 - * Film Academy: Film I, II, III, Practicum
 - * Arts Academy: Digital Art I, II, III, Practicum
 - * Audio Academy: Music Industry Audio Production I, II, III, Practicum
- The Applied Arts Practicum is a senior capstone course that provides students with the opportunity to apply the skills and knowledge learned in the previous three years of their academy within a professional, working environment. All students complete and showcase a culminating project/portfolio to an industry panel and the public.
- Schoolwide Project-Based Learning (PBL) allows students to apply knowledge and skills through complex real-world questions, problems or challenges while integrating their academy skills.
- In addition to six credit-bearing courses a semester, students are scheduled into an Advisory period that explicitly fosters academic and social-emotional growth, community, and opportunities for service.

- WCS does not rank students numerically. For the purpose of honors recognition in WCS high schools, we only use the following Latin system:
 - Summa Cum Laude 4.25 and above GPA
 - Magna Cum Laude 4.0-4.24 GPA
 Cum Laude 3.75-3.99 GPA

- The WCS averaging policy allows students to receive a full credit if they
 failed the first semester. This is only possible if the average of both
 semesters is 60 or higher. The averaging policy only applies to the
 following courses: Math, World Language, and Chemistry.

Beginning with the 2025-26 school year, WCS began recalculating GPAs of transfer students using the WCS weighted scale to create a uniform Weighted Cumulative GPA for all WCS students. Prior to the 2025-26 school year, GPAs of transfer students were taken "as is" from their prior school, whether weighted or unweighted.
