Community & School Overview

Summit High School, founded in 2010 in Spring Hill, TN, is a four-year public high school located 30 miles south of Nashville. Serving a rapidly growing community of around 59,000 residents, Summit is one of eleven high schools in the Williamson County School District, where students consistently achieve some of the highest test scores in the state.

At Summit, students take six academic classes and one study hall, with the option to waive study hall for a seventh course if space allows. The school operates on a schedule of seven 48-minute periods from Monday to Friday, with a total enrollment of 1,682 students, including 426 seniors. SHS offers 24 AP courses, 19 TSSAA sports, and various student clubs. Summit High School uses standards-based grading.

Curriculum

Summit High School offers honors, Advanced Placement, and dual enrollment coursework for most core classes, along with eight College, Career & Tech Programs: Culinary Arts, Early Childhood Education, Marketing, Business, Medical Science, TV & Film Production, PLTW Engineering, and Digital Art Design.
